Back at the end of September ten intrepid members of RAFA Global Branch 1370 made their separate journeys into the wilds of Norfolk with the intention of visiting the 'RAF Coltishall Heritage Centre' and then the 'City of Norwich Aviation Centre'.

We arrived at Norwich 'Premier Inn' at various times on the Friday afternoon and fully armed with the 'Meal Deal' had our meet and greet at 19.00 in the Restaurant, and apart from the fact that Steve's choice from the menu was usually 'taken off' it all went very well with lots of chat and banter.

Saturday morning started (of course) with a 'Full English' and as much of the toast, cereals, croissant, coffee, tea etc. that time and stomach room would allow, and then the 20 minute drive to what had been RAF Coltishall.

Originally built as a Bomber Station in 1939 it changed to a Fighter Station in 1940

with Supermarine Spitfires and Hawker Hurricanes. Douglas Bader commanded 242 Squadron there. In the 'Cold War' period Coltishall had multi roles. Two air sea rescue squadrons, flying Westland Sycamore, Whirlwind, Wessex and Sea King helicopters. Also English Electric Lightning Squadrons with 42 aircraft at its peak.

It was also a 'V' Bomber Dispersal Airfield and Concord even landed there once.

Although no longer active Coltishall still has the feel of a traditional RAF Station even though since the closure in 2006 it has had a few changes of use. It now belongs to Norfolk County



Council who bought it in 2012, and various private enterprises occupy the hangars and some buildings. Thankfully some areas and buildings have been taken on by the Coltishall Heritage Group of volunteers and we were given a brilliant guided tour of these areas that have been retained to show the history of this Airfield.

With lunch now calling it was a short drive to our next venue, the City of Norwich Aviation Museum, which is a volunteer-run museum and charitable trust dedicated to the preservation of the aviation history and located on the northern edge of Norwich International Airport, reached by road through the village of Horsham St Faith.

Although not a large site it is crammed with interesting items and aircraft, and you don't have to be an Aircraft or RAF fanatic to enjoy and appreciate it.



### **PENSION NEWS**

The following item appeared in the Pension Society Journal:

Anyone serving after April 1975 and now over 60 or over could have an Armed Forces Pension if they served for 2 years or more.

The pension is **NOT** paid automatically - Veterans must apply to the Veterans UK using AFPS Form 8 or can call 0800-085-3600 for further information.

### **VETERANS ID CARD**

Right folks. For those that are interested. It looks like the Veteran ID cards are starting to get rolled out.

As usual, with GOV.UK it looks like they are rolling these out in batches of 4000 to start with until they can cope with the numbers.

Expect the website to crash regularly and the link not to be available all the time. Once they hit their allocation of 4000 for the period they are receiving applications, the link will disappear until it is next available. We don't know what that period of time is at the moment.

What you will need:

- 1. A mobile phone or laptop/,PC with a camera.
- 2. Photographic ID Drivers Licence/Passport.
- 3. Your service number.
- 4. Branch of service Army, Navy, RAF
- 5. Your full name as it was when you served.
- 6. Residential address.

Make sure you have that ready, it will save time.

The process will be much like any other online process. It will want your details typed in and photos of ID uploaded. It may also ask for a selfie of yourself to compare with the ID uploaded. So, not overly complicated.

To access the online service, check this link or Google search HM Armed Forces Veterans ID card regularly.

During the process, you may be asked to create a GOV.UK login. This requires an email address, and a mobile number.

There will eventually be a postal option, for those that don't have access to a mobile or computer or are just technophobes. Expect this option to take longer and will most likely involve sending original documents in and I suspect there will be a cost associated with. That isn't confirmed. This may be something Post Office Counters can deal with in the future.

Our very own Dave Routledge took part in the initial trial, so I am sure he will be only too happy to help if you encounter any problems.



### REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY 2023 AT THE CENOTAPH




15 Branch members attended this event, yet not one of them has offered to report any recollection. Is this amnesia induced by the onset of senility or, and more likely, alcohol?

### REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY IN WALES



Following the closure of RAF St Athan, the town of Llantwit Major was determined to go ahead with a Remembrance Day parade. The sprawling expanse of St Athan has for decades been the lifeblood of its local town, but now that it's largely empty we see new, incoming families moving into new housing estates rather than the old, deteriorating RAF MQs.

Without the annual presence of the RAF St Athan Voluntary Band, now disbanded (no pun intended), the Town Council arranged for a Land Rover with a Tannoy to lead with the marching tunes, followed by the only available military presence, the University of Wales Air Squadron (UWAS) cadets. The young squadron did a sterling job on the day and the town was extremely grateful for their enthusiasm. A flight of veterans of all ages marched

behind the cadets, one or two in wheelchairs and one former RAF boxer in his 80's, doing his best in his personal fight to keep up

with the parade.

Ripples of applause greeted the marchers going through the town diligently marshaled by the Town Council staff and local police. This was a day that involved the whole town; RAF Cadets, Vets Associations, Air Cadets (formerly ATC), Scouts, Guides, Brownies, Play Groups...I could go on. The ceremony itself was conducted expertly by our local Canon, with a respectful silence immaculately observed by the whole parade. The ceremony included the reading out of the 42 names on the town memorial by RAF veteran Paul Lindsey and then the laying of numerous wreaths. The parade concluded with a marchpast, with the salute taken by the Town Mayor and dignitaries and OC No. 4 S of TT.



The Llantwit Major Rugby Club generously hosted a post-parade reception and there was an overall feeling of a job well done. A few tweaks and we can look forward to many more years of honouring our heroes, even without a significant military presence.
